

BASIC BEANIE Cuffed Version in Sirdar Alpine

We added some extra length to our Basic Beanie to make a cuff for this stylish furry hat.

Finished Size: Child/Adult Small (Adult Medium, Adult Large).

Approx. 18 (20, 22)"/46 (51, 56)cm circumference.

Yarn: 2 skeins Sirdar Alpine (50g, 36 yds/33m each), or approx. 50 (60, 75) yds/46 (55, 69)m

of a super-bulky weight yarn.

Needles US 13 (9mm) 16"/40cm circular and double-point needles, or size to obtain gauge.

& Notions: US 11 (8mm) 16"/40cm or one size smaller than gauge needle for cast-on.

5 stitch markers, 1 in a different color. Darning needle to finish.

Gauge: $8 \text{ sts} = 4^{\text{"}}/10 \text{cm}$ in stockinette stitch in the round.

Glossary: K2Tog = knit 2 stitches together; St(s) = stitch(es).

To adjust size, add or subtract stitches in multiples of 5.

Cast on: With smaller needles, using long tail cast-on method, cast on 35 (40, 45) sts. Place your

different-colored marker and join in round, being careful not to twist.

Straight Section: Knit every round, slipping marker as you go, until work measures 1½"/4cm.

Change to **larger needles** and knit every round, until work measures 8 (8¼, 8½)"/ 20.5 (21, 21.5)cm from cast-on edge of beanie; **on last round, place 4 more markers in**

another color, every 7 (8, 9) sts.

Decreases: Note: Change to double-point needles when necessary.

Round 1: *Knit to 2 sts before marker, K2Tog*; repeat between * * around. (5 sts decreased)

Round 2: Knit.

Repeat Round 1 only (decreasing every round) until 5 sts remain.

Finishing: Break yarn, leaving an 8"/20cm tail. With darning needle, thread tail through all 5 sts one at

a time. Draw up tightly and proceed to finishing.

Blocking: Weave in ends on wrong side. Turn up bottom edge for cuff. No blocking required!

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
