

LITTLE MOHAIR SCARF: Wool and the Gang *Take Care Mohair* Version

Our perennially favorite little one-skein scarf (this time in Wool and the Gang's voluptuous Take Care Mohair) adds fluff and fun to weather the winter. In a soft, sweet shade or a brash bright, this quick-to-knit little scarf is just the right size to knot at the neck or wrap and tuck in.

Plus, it's the perfect 'who wouldn't want one' gift!

Finished size: Approx. $5 \times 40^{\circ}/13 \times 102$ cm.

Yarn: 1 skein Wool and the Gang Take Care Mohair (50g, 109 yds/100m); or approx. 109

yds/100m) of an equivalent worsted-weight mohair yarn.

Needles US 10 (6mm) needles, or size to obtain gauge with a soft, lofty ribbed fabric.

& Notions: Blunt darning needle to finish.

Gauge: Approx. 16 sts = 4"/10cm in K1/P1 ribbing, <u>not</u> stretched.

Glossary: K = knit; P = purl; St(s) = stitch(es).

Note: Even the best mohair has a tendency to shed a little. We suggest you drape a tea towel in your

lap to catch the fibers as you work. Give it good shake before wearing.

Cast on: Using cable cast-on method, cast on 20 sts; work sts firmly and close together to help keep

the bottom edge from splaying.

Ribbing: Row 1: *K1, P1*; repeat between * * to end.

Repeat Row 1 until you have just enough yarn left to bind off.

Bind off: Bind off all sts in pattern, working firmly.

Finishing: Weave in ends as invisibly as possible. Soak for 20 minutes in tepid water with no-rinse

wool soap. Gently squeeze out as much water as possible. Roll up in towel and gently squeeze out more moisture, or place in a lingerie bag and run through <u>spin-only</u> cycle in washing machine. Lay flat without stretching; straighten edges. Allow to dry thoroughly.

Give it a little shake!
